Referring to local communities throughout Offaly, with many volunteers from areas within the county present, reinvigorating their commitment he said, "everything is possible and it doesn't have to be this way" and that, "more than ever now is a time for leadership in communities." He added that, "if you wait for government...you will

be waiting."

He said "the arrival of Ukrainians is the most positive thing to happen in Ireland in a long time" and that it will prove to be an "absolute positive for our community."

In concluding he advised, "look around your community and ask: what do you want to change?" There followed a captivating Questions & Answers session with lively participation, discussing issues such as fuel poverty, South Offaly Special Olympics and the updates of Offaly PPN. A draw with a multitude of fabulous hampers provided by Hereford and More, Tullamore, ended proceedings on a high note with winners hailing from every corner of the county. A positively life-affirming event for those who are passionate about improving their communities, the next Offaly PPN Plenary meeting is planned for November 2022 (with details to follow later).
